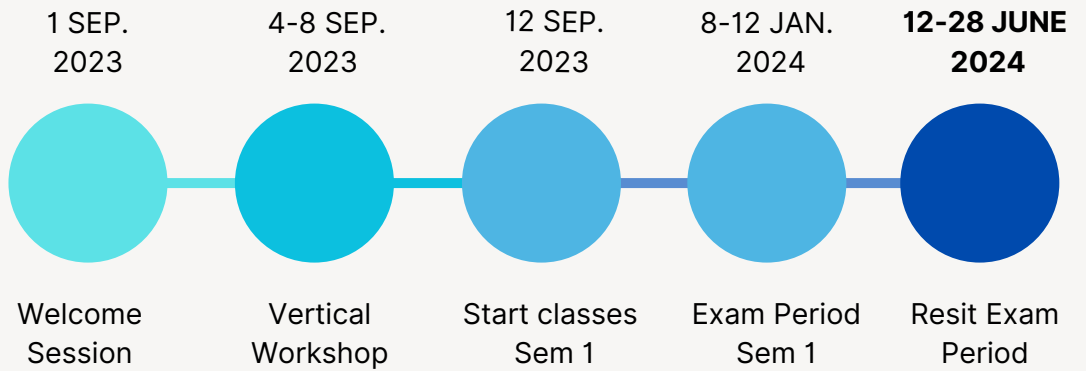

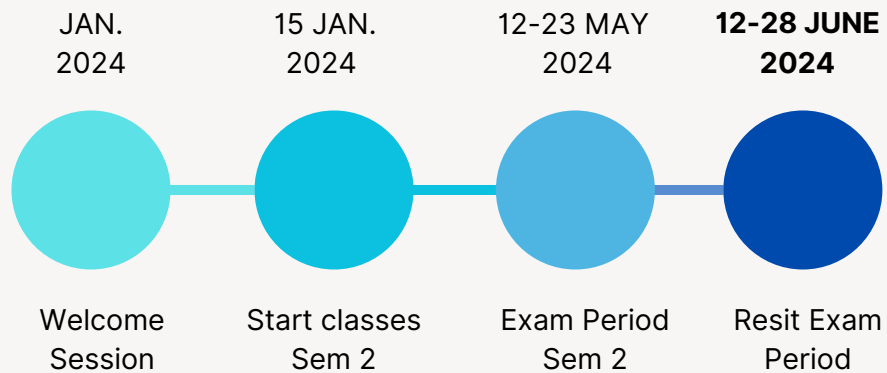

Language requirements

Language of instruction

The subjects are held in Spanish and English. Consult the Faculty webpage and/or the list of subjects available to verify each specific subject.

Required level of Spanish

B2 level (for subjects taught in Spanish). Native Spanish speakers are exempt from language accreditation.

Required level of English

B2 level (for subjects in English). Native English speakers are exempt from language accreditation

Certificates

An official language certificate is required. Otherwise, the certificate must be issued by a language school, or a language professor/department from your home university.

Certificates obtained by taking the Erasmus OLS Mobility Test will **not** be accepted.

STEP 2

Complete your application

Freemovers

- Visiting students must pay their tuition fees to UIC Barcelona.
- The **payment will be made once the student has arrived at UIC Barcelona**, and his/her Learning Agreement and possible changes have been enrolled.
- Students must go to the secretariat in their faculty to ask for an enrolment sheet and payment instructions, or download them on the intranet. A single payment will be accepted, via bank transfer or credit card. You cannot pay in installments.
- If students are taking subjects in various faculties, they must obtain an enrolment sheet for each faculty individually.

STEP 2

Other academic information

Attendance

- Attendance is compulsory. Absences must be justified.
- Students with less than **50%** attendance may be expelled from the course.

Examinations

- If two exams overlap, the student must notify the lecturers and the lecturer who teaches the higher year subject must change the date.
- For further information, students should read UIC Barcelona's internal regulations and the assessment procedure for each subject.

How to make a complaint/ official request

- Official requests must be made through the School secretariat. Before making an official request, we recommend talking to your coordinator and the International Relations Department.

STEP 3

Complete your LA

Learning Agreement

- Bilateral or Erasmus (no fees) students who come for an entire academic year must choose the subjects for both semesters.
- Visiting students (who pay fees) who come for an entire academic year must choose the subjects at the start of each semester.
- You must send your Learning Agreement to your academic coordinator so they can approve it through the online platform (OLA or Relint)
- Once at UIC Barcelona, students **must** attend a meeting with their coordinator about their Learning Agreement.
- To confirm your stay at UIC, your Learning Agreement **must be confirmed** by your coordinator beforehand.
- **Students must always follow the instructions provided by their coordinator.**

How to choose courses?

- See the course catalogue for information about the courses available for international students.
- You can **only** select courses from this list.
- Carefully read all the information you receive from your coordinator.
- These subjects must be discussed and agreed with your mobility coordinator at your home university.
- You **cannot** take **more than 15%** of your total credits **outside the faculty**. Including language courses.

STEP 3

Complete your LA

Timetables

- It is the **student's responsibility** to ensure that they take subjects that do not involve a timetable clash.
- We'll send the timetable to students via email once it has been confirmed.
Definitive schedules will be sent at the beginning of the semester.
- During their stay, students will be able to read timetables and exam announcements in the hallway.

Enrolment

- Students will be enrolled once their Learning Agreement has been approved.

Are students allowed to extend their stay?

- They can ask for this by making an official written request.
- The application must be accepted by UIC Barcelona and by the home university.

STEP 6

Changes in LA

Once classes have begun and for a period of approximately **2 weeks** students can change the subjects they are enrolled for.

How to proceed

- 1 Contact your academic coordinator at UIC Barcelona.
- 2 If the academic coordinator at UIC Barcelona approves the changes, contact the academic coordinator in your home university.
- 3 If the academic coordinator in your home university approves the changes, students must add and send these changes via the "modifications" tab of their Learning Agreement online.

Changes after the deadlines will **not** be accepted.
