
Business Administration studies: Grants for Academic Excellence

The UIC is committed to excellence

The Universitat Internacional de Catalunya (UIC) has set up a study grant programme for students with excellent academic results (Talent and Effort), based on its commitment to contribute to the resolution of specific needs in society.



The grants cover 80 % of the enrolment fees for every academic year throughout their degree programme. The total cost therefore becomes around €1.900/year, which is similar to what students normally pay in state universities. This grant is compatible with the discount the UIC already provides for large families.

The grant programme is supported financially by a grant fund held by the Fundación Familiar Catalana (Catalan Family Foundation). For this edition (during the 2014-2015 academic year), grants will be offered to Business Administration (ADE) students. The aim of the programme, therefore, is to contribute in a positive way in an economic climate which demands both entrepreneurial and innovative skills, as well as more job opportunities. In fact, the specific gualities of a good entrepreneur (technical knowledge, social sensitivity, interpersonal skills, etc.) are also the defining features of Business Administration Studies in the UIC.

Terms and conditions 2014-2015 academic year

A limited number of grants will be awarded. The following requirements must be met in order to apply for the call, however fulfilling them does not guarantee that the grant will be awarded.



- A final mark of a minimum of an (average of) 8 for the 1st year of your baccalaureate (upper-secondary) studies.
- A pass mark in the UIC-specific test for Business Administration studies, as part of the call for BEA grants.



None. For the aforementioned reasons, and due to the fact that the aim is to reward talent and effort, participation in the grant programme will not be subject to any financial requirements at either a personal or family level.



The grant application must be filled in and delivered to us by Wednesday 7 May.

The official form must be filled in online here: www.uic.es/bea and the applicant's academic transcript from the 1st year of their baccalaureate (upper secondary) studies must also be provided, as well as a photocopy of their National Identity Card or Passport. This documentation can either be sent by email to this address: (gfluxa@ uic.es), by recorded postal delivery, or can be delivered in person to the Barcelona campus during normal office hours.

Presentation of the application form automatically includes registration for the specific entrance exam to apply for the call for the Grants for Academic Excellence (BEA), which will take place on Friday 9 May, at 3:30 pm, on our Barcelona campus (c/ Immaculada, 22).
