

INFORMATION

The Spanish National Conference of Dentistry Deans (CADO) has put forward an idea for a new exam that will allow complementary learning requirements to be met for people who are applying for official homologation of their degree to a Spanish degree that enables them to exercise as a dentist. They must also have received the corresponding letter entitled “Resolution of supplementary learning requirements”.

This exam is scheduled to take place on Friday, 29 October, 2021 and will be carried out simultaneously in the following dental schools:

The registration deadline at the above-mentioned dental schools shall open sufficiently in advance. It is important to note that the participating faculties of dentistry belong to both public and private universities and that enrolment fees will vary according to the regulations in each university.

Each faculty of dentistry out of the ones listed will offer a limited and different number of places for the exam, and when the advertised number of places is full the opportunity to sign up at that faculty will be closed.

A committee appointed by CRADO will write up the exams, that will be specific to each subject to be passed and identical in all faculties, it will also be multiple-choice, with five answers, only one of which is correct.

The exam to be passed in each subject area will consist of two parts, a theoretical part, which all candidates will sit, and a second part to evaluate the application of clinical competences, which only people who have passed the theoretical part can sit. The second part will take place at a later date, with enough advance warning, and will be carried out, as in the theoretical case, in all faculties on the same date and at the same time, since it will be the same exam for everyone.

The questions will be written by lecturers from the various areas of knowledge from faculties of dentistry in Spain, based on the syllabus they teach for each subject, therefore the recommended reading will be the same as that provided in the course guides for each subject in each faculty of dentistry.

The Spanish Ministry of Universities, as an exception, will work with CRADO to organise the exams.
