

1.1. About UIC Barcelona

The International University of Catalonia (UIC Barcelona) is a private, non-profit university created by the *la Fundació Familiar Catalana*. Since 1997, UIC Barcelona has had the objective of serving society by offering a wide range of high-quality university education and promoting research in accordance with the principles of Christian humanism.

Currently, UIC Barcelona has more than 4,400 students and offers a total of 17 university degrees. Our range of Bachelor's degree programs is complemented by a wide range of master's, postgraduate and doctoral programs, as well as continuing education programs that allow students to broaden their training and specialize in different areas of knowledge.

UIC Barcelona welcomes students of 70 nationalities and teaching staff of 18 nationalities. It has funding for university undergraduate and master's programs (including scholarships granted by the Ministry of Education, according to data for the 2013-2014 academic year, for 636,956.36 euros) and has 263 students with scholarships for undergraduate and master's programs.

We have a total of 13,450 students (7,984 undergraduate and 5,466 postgraduates, 13.36% of our students and 5.83% of our teaching staff are from overseas. The university is international in nature, which not only allows students to study part of their academic program in foreign universities, but also allows them to gain professional experience by undertaking internships abroad. We currently have 151 Erasmus agreements and more than 85 bilateral agreements and memoranda of understanding currently in place.

Another key objective for UIC Barcelona is to carry out research in all areas of knowledge in order to contribute to the development of science and technology and improve the quality of life in Spanish society. This is UIC Barcelona's commitment to its students and society. At UIC Barcelona, the university experience is as comprehensive and intensive as possible. UIC Barcelona is also home to the Institute for Research in Evaluation and Public Policy (IRAPP), the Institute of Higher Family Studies, the University Institute of Patients, the Bioengineering Institute of Technology, and the Institute for Multilingualism.



At UIC Barcelona we base our work on study, continuous research and the development of educational methods. Our teaching staff provides a bridge between the university and the business world, always based on the transmission of experience and knowledge. More than 50 companies and institutions have placed their trust in the centers, institutes and chairs of UIC Barcelona, in order to undertake applied research activities. Thanks to UIC Barcelona companies' job placement programs, the university maintains close ties with the business community. UIC Barcelona also has more than 2,250 agreements for work placements in companies in different industrial sectors, both in Spain and the rest of the world. Most of the teaching staff have professional experience.

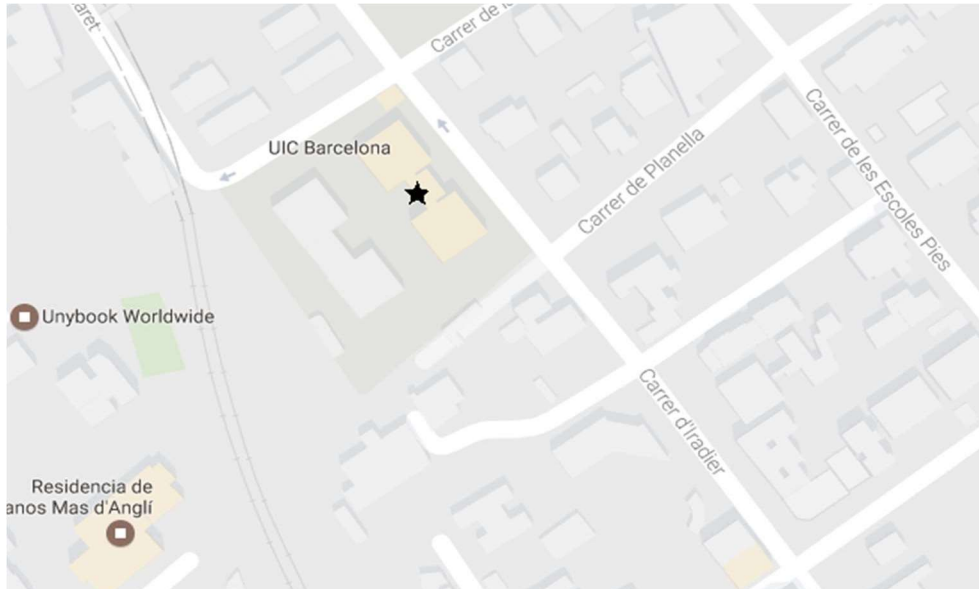

3.2. Evaluation

2.2.1 Continuous Assessment

In UIC Barcelona, the assessment system differs in some aspects from those in other countries. It is important to know that attendance is mandatory and counts towards the final assessment. Students with an attendance rate less than 50% can be excluded from the subject.

Students who are unable to attend classes must notify the faculty in advance and bring written justification for their absence, but they may have points deducted from their final grade. In addition to continuous assessment, the assessment includes the submission of assignments, results of mid-term exams, presentations, etc.

2.2.2. Examinations

Ordinary sitting

Students have the right to enroll once in any subject and therefore be entitled to two ordinary exam sittings per subject.

Second sitting

Students who do not pass the first sitting may try again in the second sitting, but may only achieve a maximum grade of 7. The second sitting is only open to students who have not passed the subject in the first sitting, therefore cannot be taken to improve the grade obtained in the first sitting.

Exam dates

Exam dates will be published during each semester. See periods in the academic calendar 22-23.

All exams are face-to-face.

1st semester: December for 3rd and 4th year subjects and January for 1st and 2nd year subjects.

2nd semester: May for all courses.

2nd sitting: June for all courses.

Evaluation policy

- a) Absence from an exam is equivalent to NS (no show).
- b) Copying during any exam will result in a grade of 0.

Any attempt to distort or defraud the systems for verifying academic performance will be considered serious misconduct and inappropriate behavior.

The sanctions that will be applied to serious misconduct are the prohibition to take the exam or a grade of 0 in all or some of the exams, and in all or some of the subjects in which the student is enrolled, with the consequent loss of all the enrolment rights.

For further details, students should consult the internal regulations of the UIC and the subject-specific assessment process.

Change of exam dates

The dates of the first and second sittings of exams are established by the Faculty Board.

Examination dates CANNOT be changed unless t unless one of the following documented reasons exists:

- a) Serious illness (involving hospitalization or long convalescence).
- b) Death of an immediate family member (first or second degree only)
- c) Court summons
- d) Professional sporting competition, if you are a member of a federation.

To change any official exam at the UIC the student must:

1. Request formal authorization from the Faculty by a request document prior to the examination date (infoade@uic.es)
2. Once the authorization is obtained from the Faculty, the student must confirm the decision with the UIC course lecturer.

When exams overlap, students should inform the Secretary of the Faculty (infoade@uic.es) through a Request document at least 2 weeks in advance to find a solution. Otherwise, the student will be obliged to attend the exams, therefore one will have to be missed.

3. Academic procedures during your stay at UIC Barcelona

3.1. Changes in the Learning Agreement (LA)

Erasmus and Bilateral Students: 10 days from the beginning of the semester to make changes in your LA.

Please check the deadline with your faculty coordinator (a.akhmedova@uic.es). After the deadline, no changes will be allowed. This implies that you must take the subjects that are in the LA.

How to proceed:

1. Contact the academic coordinator from your home university to agree on changes of subjects.
2. Contact the academic coordinator at UIC Barcelona and include the changes in your LA.
3. Enter and send the changes in Relint/OLA.
4. Remember that no more than 15% of total credits can be taken at another faculty (maximum 1-2 subjects).
5. You must have the original signature of the mobility coordinator (a.akhmedova@uic.es) on your LA.

You must send an email to your coordinator informing her that you have made changes to your LA for their approval. **If you do not send an email to your coordinator, the changes will not be applied.** If the changes to the LA are not signed by the UIC coordinator and the student, the changes are not official and will not be implemented.

3.2. Enrolment fees for visiting students

Visiting students must pay their tuition fees to UIC Barcelona. The payment will be made once the student has arrived at UIC Barcelona and is enrolled for their Learning Agreement and any changes they want to make to it.

Students must go to the Secretariat in their Faculty (infoade@uic.es) to ask for an enrolment sheet and payment instructions, or download them on the intranet. A single payment will be accepted, via bank transfer or credit card. You cannot pay in instalments.

4. Academic procedures after the stay at UIC Barcelona

4.1. Grades

The validation process will take place at your home university. Your grades will be sent by the Department of International Relations (exchange.bcn@uic.es). To obtain your final grades and be able to make the validations at your home university, you must contact the International Relations Office (exchange.bcn@uic.es).
