"Climate Action and Ethics"

Competition terms and conditions and presentation of research projects and teaching proposals

Who can participate?

Groups from two to six students in any UIC Barcelona bachelor's or postgraduate degree programme.

What should be addressed?

Any problem or issue related to health and climate change and its social consequences; do the research and provide solutions for improvement. The research results must be presented in one the supported formats: **research project or teaching proposal.**

How should it be presented?

An oral presentation must be given to a group of expert evaluators and the university community that must include the research project or a teaching proposal on a situation or a problem related to climate action (SDG 13) and its ethical and social consequences.

Presentations must be based on research and must present feasible solutions from the perspective of the undergraduate or graduate studies (education, engineering, health, culture, economics, law, etc) that the students are studying.

If the teaching proposal modality is chosen, it must be applicable in an educational setting.

How will it be evaluated?

The project will be evaluated for viability and sustainability.

The research project will be evaluated on the rigorous analysis of the problem from a comprehensive sustainability approach and a communicative approach. Additionally, it must include the following points: title, theoretical framework, research objectives, research methodology, results, discussion and bibliographical references. Finally, it must be adapted to the presentation time (10 minutes maximum).

The teaching proposal modality must develop the following aspects: learning objectives, contents, implementation methodology, activities, resources, curricular adaptations and evaluation. In addition, it must adapt to the presentation time, which is 10 minutes maximum.

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Most of the projects presented will form part of an assignment in some subject; and therefore, an academic evaluation will be made in the corresponding subject.

A total of three prizes will be awarded:

- 1st prize for the best research project (bachelor's degree): academic certificate and a €300 gift voucher for the Garbí bookshop.
- 1st prize for the best research project (postgraduate degree): academic certificate and a €300 gift voucher for the Garbí bookshop.
- 1st prize for the best teaching proposal: academic certificate and a €300 gift voucher for the Garbí bookshop.

When is the deadline for submitting projects?

Defence and evaluation of the projects will take place on 3 May, starting at 8.30 a.m.
