

## **OUTGOING MOBILITY REGULATIONS 26-27**

### **Bachelor's Degree in Bioengineering**

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## I. Application and participation criteria

In order to **apply for** a place in a mobility programme, whether Erasmus+, SICUE, bilateral agreement or as a freemover/visitor, all students of the degree must meet the following requirements:

1. Be in the **3rd year** of the degree.
2. Have all the subjects passed. Those students with a maximum of **1** failed subjects may also submit the application, but they must have passed the subjects before carrying out the mobility.
3. Follow all the procedures established by International Relations to make the request through the online form.
4. Students who apply for a place to carry out their mobility in **the 4th year** must be during the **2nd semester**.

In order to **participate** in a mobility programme, whether Erasmus+, SICUE, bilateral agreement or as a freemover/visitor, students must meet the following requirements, in addition to those described above:

- A. Have passed **all** the subjects of the **3rd year** before starting the mobility stay.
- B. Meet the language requirements established by the host university.
- C. Students must take **the same number of credits (30 ECTS)** at the host university, with the aim of covering the same number of credits that they should take at UIC Barcelona.

## II. Temporary conditions of stay

**Temporary conditions** of stay, whether Erasmus+, SICUE, bilateral agreement or as a freemover/visitor:

- A. Mobilities can be for a maximum of **1 semester**.
- B. Once the stay has begun, it will **NOT** be possible to extend or reduce the duration of the stay.
- C. **No** more than one mobility may be carried out in the same academic year.

### III. How to Apply

- A. Find the receiving group and start the conversations to carry out the stay
- B. Complete the application via the online form to International Relations by the deadline.

### IV. Criteria for participation in the Berkeley Call

1. Have passed the **2nd year**.
2. A good academic record is essential(**greater than 2.5 out of 4**).
3. Minimum proof of a B2 level of English.

### V. Extraordinary Resolution

After the closing of the minutes of the 2nd call of the current academic year, each student with an assigned place will check that they continue to comply with the academic regulations in order to be able to go on mobility.

In the event of not complying with it, the Faculty will contact you to indicate the cancellation of the same. The student always has the possibility of submitting an application to the School Board that will assess each case individually.

### VI. Gestión del Learning Agreement/Training Agreement

The *Learning Agreement* (LA) is the learning agreement that details the proposed subjects that will be taken at the destination and will be validated on your return to UIC Barcelona. It is done on the corresponding platform:

- For Erasmus+ mobility: OLA + Relint 3.0
- For all other mobility: Relint 3.0

The LA must be signed by the student, the academic coordinator of UIC Barcelona and the coordinator of the host university.

Students who are going to participate in a mobility programme, and who already have a

place assigned, must establish their study plan before moving to the host university.

To do this, they will have to make a proposal for a *Learning Agreement* and propose a meeting to the Faculty's Mobility Coordinator. This academic agreement, understood as an agreement between the student and the Faculty, establishes the guidelines that will be followed when validating the UIC subjects for which they will be taken abroad.

The deadline for creating the *Learning Agreement* document is set by the host university and UIC Barcelona.

The *Training Agreement* (T.A) is the document detailing the characteristics of the internships to be carried out at the destination centre. These internships will be validated on your return to UIC Barcelona. This document must be completed only when it is an Erasmus+ mobility.

All internship mobilities, whether within the EU (Erasmus+), outside the EU (Bilateral) or within the national territory (SICUE), must be reflected in the Relint 3.0 programme (Learning Agreement tab).

## **Honors**

In no case will the honors obtained during a mobility be validated. The numerical mark obtained once the equivalence of marks has been made will appear.

## **Validation without a numerical grade**

If the numerical grade does not appear in any of the subjects of the certificate, and provided that it is approved, it will be validated with the number that corresponds to the average grade of other subjects that the student has taken in their mobility, in order to maintain the average.

## VII. Cancellation of places

Once the place has been accepted and the nomination period has ended, when the student has already begun to manage his/her enrolment at the host university, it is only possible to renounce the assigned place if there is a justified reason (serious health problems, unexpected financial problems, and/or not having obtained the required language qualification).
