


FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

DENTISTRY



GENERAL INFORMATION

How many places are available for the Bachelor's Degree in Dentistry and the Dentistry Programme?

We have 80 places for the Bachelor's Degree in Dentistry and 40 for the Dentistry Programme.

How much does the first year of the Bachelor's Degree in Dentistry cost?

310 € / ECTS x 60 = 18.600 €*
2026-2027 academic year

*Subject to annual review.

Are there any additional costs?

Yes, from 3rd year onwards students will start their practical classes in our University Dental Clinic (CUO). They must then buy the specific instruments they require.

Do students need to buy books for classes?

No, the teaching material can be found on the university's digital platform and in the library.

Are there any grants or financial aid for the Bachelor's Degree in Dentistry?

What is the class timetable?

Monday to Friday mornings and afternoons, depending on the work placement groups.

When do the practicums start?

Internships start from the 1st year.

In 2nd year we have practical classes in the pre-clinic laboratories and students begin work placements at the University Dental Clinic (CUO).

From 4th year there are also work placement agreements in external centres.

ACCESS ROUTES

What happens if I finished my upper secondary school studies two years ago and I haven't started my university studies?

We don't have a cut-off mark. As long as you have passed the Spanish university entrance exams (PAU), you are eligible to apply.

Can I take the upper secondary route if I have started or completed university studies?

No, there is specific access route for students who have started or completed university studies.

Can I take the entrance examinations if I come from a social science, humanities or artistic upper secondary track?

Yes.

Can I take the entrance examinations if I have taken a Higher Level Vocational Training Course (CFGS) not related to health?

Yes.

TESTS AND ADMISSION PROCESSES

What is the cut-off mark for admission into the Bachelor's Degree in Dentistry?

As this is a private university, there is no cut-off requirement. Admission into the bachelor's degree will depend on the outcome of the relevant entrance exams and the average mark from your academic record.

What do the entrance exams involve?

They consist of:

- A psychometric reasoning test
- An English test
- A general culture test
- A specific test for CFGS students
- Personal interview

Do I have more chance of being accepted if I come to the first sitting?

In the Admissions department we create a unique ranking that includes the results of all the sittings. Therefore, once each sitting has taken place, the number of candidates in the single ranking increases. Also, the number of places decreases as the sittings take place. We generally recommend coming to the first sitting.

Can I choose the date of the Entrance Examination?

You can ask for a specific date; however you must wait for confirmation from the Information and Admissions Service who will confirm the exam dates via email once they have looked over your documentation.

Are there any practice exams available?

We do not provide past papers from previous years.

Are the exams multiple choice? Yes.

What level of English is required for the exam?

Higher than B1.

How are the marks on my academic record and the entrance exams weighted?

40% for the academic record of the last completed year, 30% for the admissions tests and 30% for the personal interview.

What are the exam times?

From 8.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m. for the Spanish programme. From 3.00 p.m. to 8.00 p.m. for the English programme. The interview is done the day after the call.

When will I find out the results of the entrance exams?

The results will be sent via e-mail approximately 20 natural days after the exams have been taken.

If I am 'not admitted' can I attend the next sitting during the same academic year?

No, you can only apply for one call per academic year and only one of the two programmes (Dentistry in Spanish or English).

If I am placed on the waiting list, when will I be informed of the final decision?

The waiting list will be closed two weeks after the start of class (end of September). Until the 3 sittings have been held and the respective waiting lists have been cross-checked it is not possible to know the possibilities of admission. What's more, until the cut-off marks are published by the state universities, there will be little movement on the waiting lists.

If I have been accepted, what is the next step?

You will receive a letter of admission containing information about the next steps to take in order to reserve a place on the course, which corresponds to 20% of the fee for the first year. The remaining 80% will be paid in a single payment during the enrolment period, between July and September. (Ask about instalment payments)

If I reserve a place and then decide not to study at UIC Barcelona, will the reservation fee be reimbursed?

The reservation fee will only be returned if you do not pass your baccalaureate or PAU (national Spanish university entrance examinations) exams. This clause is laid out in the General Terms and Conditions.
