

VISA APPLICATION FROM SPAIN

All documentation must be submitted with a sworn translation carried out by a translator accredited by the Spanish Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The application must be submitted by a Spanish lawyer, as a digital certificate is required by the Immigration Office in Barcelona; it cannot be submitted in person.

The application for a student visa must be submitted:

- Sixty days before the tourist visa under which the student entered Spanish territory expires.
- Two months before the start of classes. An application may only be submitted from within Spain during the two months prior to the start of the academic year in exceptional circumstances, such as those listed below:
 - No appointments were available at the Consulate, which must be demonstrated with supporting documents.
 - Enrolment procedures began during the two months prior to the start of the course.
 - The applicant did not have the necessary financial means before the two months preceding the start of the course.
 - Essential documentation for the visa application was missing, and the applicant attempted to obtain this documentation more than two months before the start of the course.

Here is the list of documents an international student must submit when applying for a student visa:

- **EX00 application form**
- **Entry declaration** or stamp on passport
- Certificate of **registration as a resident**
- **UIC Barcelona enrolment**
- Complete copy of the current **passport**
- Proof of **medical insurance**
- Proof of **funds** (the student must show a bank balance greater than €7,200). If the student is receiving financial support from their family, they must obtain a notarised certified translation of the following:
 - Bank Statement of parent account or payment receipts
 - Declaration that the parents will financially support the student with bank transfers of a minimum of €600 per month.
- **Medical certificate**. Certificate showing that you do not have any infectious or serious diseases according to the 2005 International Health Regulations (for programmes longer than 6 months).
- **Certificate of criminal record** of the countries where you have resided for the past five years. The document must be a certified Spanish translation (for programmes longer than 6 months).
